

# Key elements of a putt

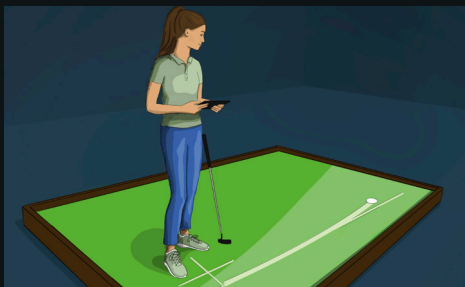


## Understanding the geometry of a putt

Being able to visualize all components of a putt is a key skill for every golfer. Understanding the relationship

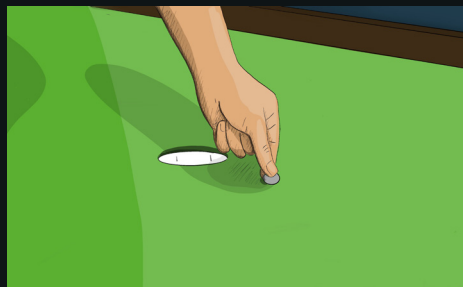
between those components will help you become a better putter. Do this drill to make sure you can read a

green correctly and learn how to find the right line for your putt.



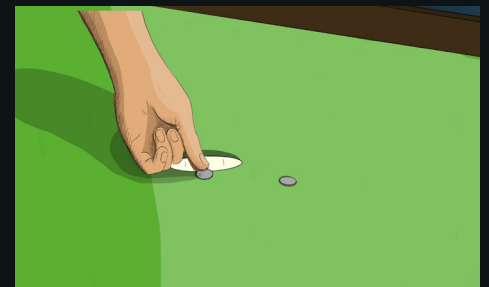
**1**

Choose a breaking putt on the green. Try to read the green and figure out how much break is in the putt you have chosen.



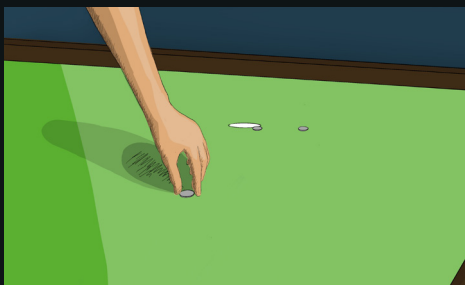

The Aim Point is a spot on the straight line. Locate the spot next to the hole and place a coin at the point you believe is the Aim Point.



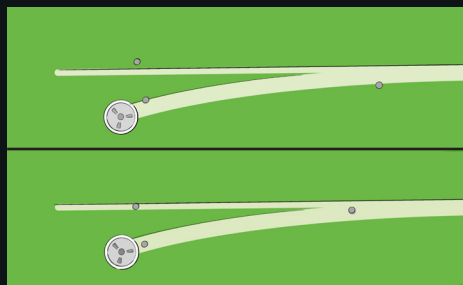

Now, place another coin on the Hole Entry Point. It is the spot where the ball will fall into the hole.



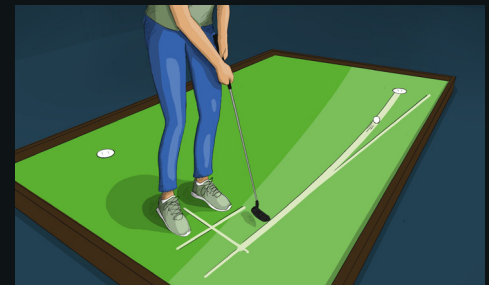

Place the last coin at the Apex Point. It's the highest point of the curve your ball is going to roll over. Move behind the ball to double check if you placed the coins correctly. Adjust if necessary.

Now, activate the Ideal Line, Aim Point and Hole Entry Point with the tablet and check if your guesses were correct.

Try to see which visual was most helpful for you and feels most natural. Then try with a different position.



By teaching you how to practice your visualization of a putt, this drill will help you improve on your green reading skills. If you are not on a Putt-View green, you can still do this drill. Simply follow all the instructions above. Then putt the putt and see if your ball rolled over the apex point and the hole entry point and if it matched with the aiming line you have chosen.
